AAPCHO and PI-CoPCE is developing a *Health Equity Response Network* to proactively engage, inform, and train the healthcare workforce to prevent and control the spread of emerging and re-emerging infectious diseases that disproportionately impact Asian American (AA), Native Hawaiian (NH), and Pacific Islander (PI) communities. Members of AAPCHO and PI-CoPCE represent an expansive primary care network capable of coordinating a clinical and community response to diseases such as tuberculosis, dengue fever, hepatitis B, and now, COVID-19.

About the Health Equity Response Network

Through AAPCHO and PI-CoPCE's network, AA-, NH-, and PI-serving community health centers are uniquely positioned to function as critical partners in the public health delivery system. The purpose of the Health Equity Response Network is to ensure **quality training and technical assistance**, **culturally responsive communication**, and **interdisciplinary coordination** of health centers and affiliated partners, the primary care organization workforce, and infectious disease subject matter experts.

Primary Functions of the Network

- Primary care strategic planning
- Sharing of resources and best practices among interdisciplinary providers
- Increasing awareness and understanding of culturally and linguistically appropriate COVID-19 testing and treatment strategies

Response Network Activities

- Physician and nurse consultation for appropriate screening, evaluation, diagnosis, management, and treatment of COVID-19 patients and persons with suspected SARS-CoV-2 infection
- Address questions on any COVID-19 related topic raised by health practitioners

Goals and Outcomes

The Health Equity Response Network aims to achieve the following long-term outcomes:

- 1. Fewer healthcare-associated infections among AA, NH, and PI patients and healthcare workers
- 2. Fewer community-acquired infections across public and private settings in underserved AA, NH, and PI communities
- 3. Improved clinical outcomes among AA, NH, and PI patients with or who are at increased risk for emerging infectious diseases.
