California Tuberculosis (TB) Experts Address the Rise in TB Cases in Impacted Communities with Existing Comorbidities and COVID-19

San Francisco, CA— In honor of World TB Day, the Coalition for a TB Free California and the Association of Asian Pacific Community Health Organizations (AAPCHO) plan to host a virtual press conference on March 24th to highlight the growing number of cases of TB in California's Asian American Native Hawaiian Pacific Islander (AANHPI), Latino, and Black communities. Moreover, even though both TB and COVID-19 are infectious diseases that affect the lungs, TB, has a longer incubation period with a slower onset of disease. *Prior to COVID-19, TB was the leading infectious disease killer in the world, claiming* **1.5 million lives each year. Before 2020, advances to eliminate TB were underway globally, but the COVID-19 pandemic has reversed years of progress made in the fight to end TB.**

California has nearly double the rate of TB disease than the nation. Join Coalition for a TB Free California and AAPCHO to hear an update from doctors, researchers, public health offices, and patients on the state of TB burden in California and its disproportionate impacts on the AANHPI community.
