DACA recipients are our family members, friends, colleagues, and community members. They have a right to affordable culturally and linguistically appropriate care.

"AAPCHO applauds President Biden and HHS Secretary Becerra for taking the steps necessary to expand health care access, regardless of immigration status. We, along with our members and partners, look forward to the Biden administration finalizing this rule so that DACA recipients can access these critical programs as soon as possible. We also continue to call on Congress to pass legislation to allow all immigrants to access the health care they need."
